



K Chandramohan's Mission – Giving Vision

Annapurani, aged 58 can see clearly and move independently today. Thanks to Palaniammal Kandasamy Charitable Trust that helped her get back vision in both eyes post removal of cataractous lens and IOL implant. The untreated Diabetes mellitus has been treated too. The Trust has been restoring vision and life for many more such Annapuranis, who struggle hard for subsistence, eye checks, surgeries, vision recovery and a normal life.

For more than a decade now, Palaniammal Kandasamy Charitable Trust has been in the forefront sponsoring eye care, free eye camps, eye surgeries and rehabilitation, for patients, mostly in the 55+ category. Around 10,000 patients have benefitted from this free eye camp organized by the Trust, in Ranipet. NTC Group's CMD and JCI's former president, senator Mr K Chandramohan, the “eye opener” and driving force behind this charitable act, ensures that the free eye camp is organized once every month without a glitch. The 158th camp conducted on Sunday, 9th July 2017 at Gangadara School, Navalpur, Ranipet goes to show the passion and dedication he has for social cause.

Mr K Chandramohan has brought together, like-minded Samaritans in JCI, Ranipet and Kovai Sankara Eye Hospital, under one umbrella, in this noble exercise. The JCI sponsors volunteers to organize the camp. Kovai Sankara Eye Hospital sends nurses, doctors and medical equipment, to the camp. The correspondent of the Gangadara School, a JCI patron himself, hosts the medical camp in the school. Those diagnosed with vision complications are shifted to the hospital in Coimbatore in a bus that is sponsored by the hospital. After treatment, the patients are dropped back in Ranipet. Approximately, 100 Ranipet citizens visit the 9 to 2 camp every month. This assemblage consists of new patients, review patients post treatment and surgeries.
